Dear Friends,

By the time you read this letter, I will be down in San Diego with 35 of our young people at a youth conference. I can't tell you how happy I am to be going to this conference and to get to know our young people just a little bit better. In my next letter, I will tell you all about what happened at the conference.

Besides always wanting to be a priest, I also wanted to be a teacher since I was a child. When I joined up with the Sacred Hearts Community in 1983, my wish was fulfilled. I taught in their high schools for over 20 years in the Los Angeles area and enjoyed every minute of it (well, almost every minute!). I taught three subjects: English, History, and Religion. I wish I could still be teaching, but I don't have the time nor the energy that I once had. I enjoy being around young people: they not only keep me current with what's going on today, but they keep me young. I did not have any young people in my last parish. In fact, the average age of the 400 parishioners I had at Most Holy Redeemer was 60! I thank God, along with the Archbishop, for putting me in a parish with so many young people.
